






SHRINES OF FRANCE PILGRIMAGE:

I was asked a question a while ago and I thought I'd do a Q&A. Anyone else have a question?

Q: I was asked why I don't give the sign of peace to the congregation but only to the ministers during Mass.

A: The answer to this one is pretty easy. Because I've already given the sign of peace to everyone when I say "The peace of the Lord be with you." Then Deacon Joe invites everyone to share the peace.



In recent months, parishioners have asked what may be done, for the parish, in the way of memorial gifts given in memory of loved ones. After some thought we've composed a list of idea.

- Due to some deaths and canceled pledges fulfilling our capital campaign pledges is going to fall \$3,200 short.
 A gift to decrease or eliminate that shortfall could be given.
- 2. A gift could be given toward the completion of the land-scaping project.
- 3. Our holy water bucket and aspergillum need to be replaced.
- 4. We have a number of candlesticks and candelabra that need to be replated.
- 5, Our white cope and humeral veil need to be replaced. A good deal of the color of the applique is gone and the stains around the neckline no longer come out.

Future items:

- 1. Installation of a hearing loop system might be useful as as our parish continues to age
- 2. At some point we will need to look at the stabilization of our stained glass windows.
- 3. It would be nice to have an automated bell ringing system like the Baptists have.

These are just some things we've thought about as a starting place. If you are interested in providing a memorial for a loved one and have other ideas, please speak to Fr. Ron.

One of our Lenten obligations is almsgiving. Regardless how little we have, there is always someone with less. We might not see them, and we might not know them (or we might, without knowing their situation) but they deserve the same as we do. Please help our brothers and sisters by participating in CRS's Operation Rice Bowl. Let's fill all our boxes by the end of Lent.
