



FROM THE DEACON'S DESK



Today, Sunday, January 10, is the beginning of Vocations Awareness week. It is appropriate that Vocations Awareness Week start on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. The Baptism of the Lord announces Jesus' public ministry and that he is favored by God, called, and sent for the victory of justice. As God's chosen servant, Jesus was sent to open the eyes of the blind and to free prisoners and those who live in darkness.

Through our Baptism, we are also favored by God, called and sent for the victory of justice. We are God's chosen servant to announce the good news that the Kingdom of God is at hand. Through our Baptism, we are all given vocations and called to live out those vocations in faithfulness to God.

And so this week, we pray but not for vocations-those were given to us at our Baptism. Instead we pray that we may all be aware of our vocations whatever they may be and that we will be open to living out our vocations. Whether it be to the priesthood, religious life (brother or sister), diaconate, single life, married life or lay ministry, God has called each of us.

We pray especially that those who God has called to the priesthood, diaconate, and religious life be aware and follow God's call. As a parish, we know how great the need is. I believe that some day, Immaculate Conception will again have a resident priest. I know that the reason that we do not have one now is not because God has not called those to serve but because those he has called are not aware. Please spend a little extra time in prayer this week-as an individual and as a family-that we all might be more aware of our vocations.

While I do believe that we will have a resident priest someday, that day is unfortunately sometime off. The reality is that for the next few years, we will have many more priests retire than men ordained. This year, we will have four priests retire and only one ordained.

It is not all bad news. The number of seminarians for our diocese is up. We also have some more good men who are entering the seminary next fall. We are blessed to have a seminarian from our own parish, James Flattery. Please keep James in your prayers as he continues to study and discern. And please pray for all our seminarians. I have put the adopt a seminarian display back up and hope each of you will take the cards of one or two seminarians and include them in your prayers. God's abundant blessings

SAINT OF THE WEEK **HILARY OF POITIERS, 315–368** Feast—January 13

This bishop and theologian, a highly cultivated pagan who became a Christian, was elected bishop of his native Poitiers, in

France, at age thirty-five, while his wife was still living. For his unwavering opposition to Arianism, the heresy that Jesus Christ was in some way subordinate to God, he was banished to Asia Minor in 356 by an Arian emperor. But he continued to study Greek theology and oppose Arianism and was sent back to France for being a "mischiefmaker." He left extensive writings and was named a Doctor of the Church in 1851.




