Last week we took up a special collection for the Medical Mission. If you would still like to help, you may do so. Be sure to mark you check, El Salvador


THANK YOU

Excerpts from Bishop Amos' Lenten Letter Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In announcing the Year of Mercy, Pope Francis noted that "The season of Lent during this Jubilee Year should also be lived more intensely as a privileged moment to celebrate and experience God's mercy" (Misericordiae Vultus 17). In his message for Lent this year, the Holy Father also stressed that this Jubilee Lent is a "...favorable time to overcome our existential alienation by listening to God's word and by

practicing the works of mercy" (Lenten Message 2016). During Lent, we are invited into a closer relationship with God through prayer and time spent with the Scriptures (MV 17

During Lent, we are invited into a closer relationship with God through acts of service. As Pope Francis has reminded us, in serving our brothers and sisters in need we "touch the flesh of Christ" (Lenten Message 2016). During Lent, we are invited to a closer relationship with God through our fasting. Pope Francis, citing Patriarch Bartholomew, calls us to a way of loving that moves us away "from what I want to what God's world needs," from simply giving things up to learning to give and so being freed from "fear, greed and compulsion" (Laudato Si 8). Perhaps we can embrace our Lenten fasting with just such a spirit.

To that end, please allow me to remind you of what is called for by our Lenten discipline: • Everyone 14 years of age or older is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday (Feb. 10, 2016) and all the Fridays of Lent. • Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday (Feb. 10, 2016) and Good Friday (March 25, 2016). • On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal one full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. • To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is a serious matter.

As Pope Francis has said, "Let us not waste this season of Lent, so favorable a time for conversion" (Lenten Message 2016)!

SAINT OF THE WEEK THE SEVEN HOLY FOUNDERS OF THE SER-VITE ORDER: 13th century Feast day—February 17

In 1233, seven Florentine laymen—two married, two widowed, three single—all well-known merchants and members of a Marian confraternity, abandoned homes, jobs, and wealth for a life of poverty, prayer, and penance at Monte Senario, where they built a chapel and hermitage. Within a few years, they formed the Order of Friar Servants of Mary, or Servites, a men-

dicant order that received formal papal approval in 1304. The seven founders, jointly canonized in 1888, are: Bonfilius, Bonajuncta, Amadeus, Hugh, Manettus, Sostene, and Alexis. Alexis, who out of modesty refused ordination, served the order in various ways as a lay brother; he outlived the other founders and reportedly died at age 110. Stations of the Cross. Starting on Friday, February 12, we will pray the stations of the cross at 6:30 PM and closing


with evening prayer. (You may come for adoration, for the stations, or for both.)
